





The following table summarizes key information about each plant selected for your property.

Plant Species	Height	Features
Nannyberry	5 m	Small white flowers and red/blue berries.
Red Osier Dogwood	1.5 m	Red stems with white flowers, red/orange fall foliage.
Gray Dogwood	3 m	Attracts songbirds.
Sandbar Willow	3 m	Takes firm root in floodplains, stabilizing soils.
Buttonbush	3 m	Flowers bloom in dense balls June-Sept.
Ninebark	3 m	Heavy foliage with showy flowers and fruit.
Highbush Cranberry	3 m	Showy white flowers and edible cranberry-like fruits.
Elderberry	2 m	Purple/black berries can be used in pies, wines, jellies, jams, and juices.
Pussy Willow	8 m	Furry catkins in early spring, prefers damp sites.
Mountain Ash	15 m	Attract birds with its orange or red berries.
Tamarack	21 m	Conifer tree, bark turns reddish brown and scaly as the tree grows.
Silver Maple	30 m	Commonly have hollow trunks that provide habitat. Yellow leaves in fall.
